POPE: A CHRISTIAN WITHOUT COURAGE IS A USELESS CHRISTIAN

"A Christian without courage, who does "A Christian without courage, who does not turn his own strength to good, who does not bother anyone, is a useless

Christian," Pope Francis said yesterday. The Pope dedicated his general audience catechesis yesterday to the virtue of fortitude, observing that it consists of the ability to live with courage and to confront the inner and outer turmoils of life.

He opened his reflection by chronicling the development of fortitude, pointing to its philosophical roots in antiquity as well as its development in the Christian tradition.

"Fortitude is first and foremost a victory against ourselves," the Pope said. "Most of the fears that arise within us are unrealistic and do not come true at all.'

POPE: THE FULLNESS OF LIFE IS **REALISED IN JESUS**

On Divine Mercy Sunday, Pope Francis noted that the "fullness of life" comes of not from the pursuit of transitory pleasure but is "realised in Jesus".

'To have life," the Pope said, "it is enough to fix one's eyes on the crucified and risen Jesus, encountering him in the sacraments and in prayer, recognising that he is present, believing in him, letting oneself be touched by his grace and guided by his example, experiencing the joy of loving like him. Every living encounter with Jesus enables us to have more life."

The Pope drew upon the disciples, despondent and secluded in the upper room, who "are going through the most tragic moment in life" to showcase how Christ's coming to them was a deeply transformative moment, one that not only reveals his mercy but also
