


CHRIST, THE POWER AND THE WISDOM OF GOD

As we enter this third week of Lent, our readings remind us of God's love for us, soon to be witnessed in the suffering and death of Christ Jesus. In the First Reading, God speaks to the people of Israel after their release from slavery in Egypt. The Ten 🖁 Commandments show his people how to freely live in service of the One who has liberated them.

St Paul in the Second Reading reflects on the way in which those who are called to follow Jesus see the crucified Christ. For those early Christians, and ourselves, this is

not a sign of God's foolishness or weakness, but a demonstration to the world of God's power and wisdom.

In this week's Gospel, we see Jesus sweep away the buyers and sellers from the Temple, which should be revered as the house of God. We are reminded that it is through Christ's suffering and death that salvation will come, and the power and wisdom of God will be revealed.

Just before the Jewish Passover Jesus went up to Jerusalem, and in the Temple he found people selling cattle and sheep and pigeons, and the money changers sitting at their counters there. Making a whip out of some cord, he drove them all out of the Temple, cattle and sheep as well, scattered the money changers' coins, knocked their tables over and said to the pigeon-sellers, 'Take all this out of here and stop turning my Father's house into a market.' Then his disciples remembered the words of scripture: Zeal for your house will devour me. The Jews intervened and said, 'What sign can you show us to justify what you have done?' Jesus answered, 'Destroy this sanctuary, and in three days I will raise it up.' The Jews replied, 'It has taken forty-six years to build this sanctuary: are you going to raise it up in three days?' But he was speaking of the sanctuary that was his body, and when Jesus rose from the dead, his disciples remembered that he had said this, and they believed the scripture and the words he had said.

LEAP OF FAITH: EASTER'S ROLE IN THE DEVELOPMENT OF LEAP YEAR

The leap year is a well-known quirk in the Gregorian calendar by which much of the

RELIGIOUS FREEDOM 'VIOLATED' IN ONE THIRD OF THE WORLD

The Holy See's Permanent Observer to the United Nations in Geneva has called for renewed international efforts

to address the ongoing violations of human rights, including freedom of religion.

Human rights, including those against freedom of thought, conscience and religion, continue to be violated on an alarming scale across the globe, Archbishop Ettore Balestrero said on Wednesday.

Speaking at the 55th Session of the Human Rights Jews an obstacle that they cannot get over, to the pagans Council, Archbishop Balestrero said discrimination and persecution of believers are on the rise worldwide.

He cited the data from the pontifical foundation Aid to the Church in Need, which shows that religious freedom is violated in almost one-third of the world's countries, affecting around 4.9 billion people.

To improve multilateral diplomacy, he said, it is important "to uphold values that are rooted in human dignity". This requires in turn "rebuilding a shared vision of our inherent nature." Full report at www.cathnews.com

POPE GOES TO HOSPITAL FOR 'DIAGNOSTIC TESTS'

After telling people at his general audience, "I'm still a bit sick", and having aides read most of his prepared remarks, Pope Francis on Tuesday

paid a brief visit to Rome's Gemelli Isola Hospital for diagnostic tests", the Vatican press office confirmed.

The 87-year-old Pope had cancelled his appointments on Saturday and Monday because of what the Vatican press office déscribed as "mild flu-symptoms" but Francis led the recitation of the Angelus prayer on Sunday without obvious difficulty. The Vatican provided no health update on Tuesday since that is his usual day off so he did not have to cancel any appointments.


